Crew News 2005-06

At the Head of the Charles on October 23, Wisconsin's varsity eight finished 9th overall and 4th among the college entries – behind Princeton, Brown and Cal. The boating: Phillips (cox), Wallen (stroke), Murphy, Vice-Reshel, Larson, Syzmanski, Kaufman, Donoghue and McMullin (bow). The varsity four with coxswain finished 6th of 26 entries and 2nd among the collegiate entries, behind only Harvard, who was rowing on their home course. The boating: Barhamand (cox), Stuart (stroke), Schneider, Anspach and Rasmussen (bow). A week later, Wisconsin led all entries in the six events entered at the Head of the Iowa.

Men's crew spent two weeks over semester break practicing in the warm weather of Austin, TX and one week in March over spring break rowing on the Rock River in Edgerton, WI. The first competition is April 8th, against Michigan in Madison. Plan to come and visit or re-visit the Porter Boathouse and cheer on the Badger boats. The ice broke (or "was broken") on Lake Mendota on Wednesday, March 29, when 7 eights were launched for the Spring's first practice on home waters.

Former Badger Paul Daniels (UW '03) has been selected to row in Oxford's "Dark Blue Boat" (the British 'varsity' shell) against Cambridge in "The Boat Race." (Oxford won the April 2nd race by 5 lengths!)

Over the spring, the NCAA is expected to address Legislative Proposal 2006-127 which would add men's crew as an NCAA sport, with the NCAA sponsoring a national championship. If approved, the rules would add a ceiling to scholarships in men's crew, a move that would substantially level the playing field among the public universities. In addition, the national championship regatta would likely move around the country each year, rather than being held exclusively on the east coast.

The 2005-06 Banquet. The annual crew banquet was held Saturday, February 18 at the Porter Boathouse. Because the weekend became too frantic when combining the Midwest Regatta and the annual Banquet, the two events were separated. Over 500 people came to the opening remarks period of the event, before the three teams separated into break-out groups, the men holding theirs near the boathouse, upstairs at the Carson Gully Commons.

Alumni Activities in 2006

A Milwaukee cocktail – following on the successful John Streur-sponsored Chicago Cocktail on November 1, 2005 - was held March 28, 2006 for over 25 rowers and supporters at the University Club. John Dragisic and Friends co-sponsored the event. A Madison area cocktail is being planned at the Porter Boathouse on June 10th (watch “www.WiscoRowing.org”); a sponsor or co-sponsor for the event is also being sought. The annual Alumni Race Day event is planned at the Porter Boathouse on Saturday, September 9, as is a Curt Drewes Appreciation Day on Saturday, October 14, 2006.

A Jablonic boat dedication may be organized for the spring of 2007, if Coach Clark needs another eight. The Jablonic Boat Fund, still open to gifts and being funded by outstanding pledges, now has a balance of over \$130,000 at the UW Foundation. As a plaque is being planned for the boathouse to highlight the fund’s concept, get your pledges, gifts and/or bequests to the Foundation this spring.

Gifts to the Program from Friends

Friends was formed in December 2004. It’s first year of operation, 2005, was very successful indeed. Gifts from Friends to the program in our first year included a racing eight, *Friends of UW Men’s Crew*, a practice four (both from a large anonymous gift), funds to send rowers to a development camp and to the World Championships in Japan in August 2005, a color printer, a video-editing laptop, two hubs and two TV screens for “Venue Racing” (real time, digitalized characterizations on a TV monitor of erg competition), a mini-DVD digital video camera for recording an individual rower’s stroke on the water, a Kohl Center style Ten Eyck erg room banner, seven radios and four electronic megaphones.

The Mission of Friends of UW Men’s Crew, Inc.

The primary mission of Friends of UW Men’s Crew is i.) to promote interest - among the alumni rowers of the University of Wisconsin–Madison (“UW”) and supporters - in the men’s crew program at UW and (ii.) to strengthen the long-term financial underpinnings of men’s crew while enriching the current program.

The UW Athletic Department has implied the continuation of the smaller booster clubs associated with many varsity sports - the Wisconsin Rowing Association or “WRA,” in the case of men’s and women’s rowing – may no longer be a priority, because the oversight requirements outweigh the urgency for near-term funds

from such smaller booster clubs. As a result, the WRA and other similar booster clubs are being allowed to “go dormant,” while more arm’s length “friends” entities have been encouraged.

Friends intends to avoid ‘booster club’ status by focusing primarily on alumni and supporter social activities as well as endowment building. Friends will refrain from: contributing any benefits to eligible athletes, such as awards, banquets and travel, or supplementing the compensation of coaches. Further, Friends will decline the use, free of charge, of UW Athletic Department logos, licenses and trademarks, which also reflects ‘booster club’ status.

A strategic plan for men’s crew was reviewed and discussed in 2003 by a group of men’s rowing alumni. The long term strategic goals of that plan were i.) to achieve the sport’s financial independence through endowment building (similar to what several Ivy League programs have already accomplished) ii.) to seek NCAA recognition of men’s crew so as to level the playing field in collegiate rowing by defining a common ceiling on the number of scholarships offered in Division I men’s rowing.

Some Notes on Donating to Men's Crew

Funds at the Athletic Department, UW Foundation or Friends

Gifts to men’s crew at UW come from many origins and go to various “funds” and destinations. **Badger Fund** gifts off-set the Athletic Department’s annual operating budgets of each of the 23 varsity sports at UW. Premiums paid the Badger Fund for a favored season ticket seating location may **NOT** be designated to a specific sport; **ALL OTHER** Badger Fund gifts may be designated toward a specific sport and off-set that sport’s annual operating budget.

Endowment fund gifts are more closely aligned with the mission of Friends. A permanent corpus of money sustains crew forever, while its annual interest and earnings support the program’s yearly operating expenses. Several colleges have targeted (or already achieved) the complete financial endowment of their crew program. Friends, following its Strategic Plan of 2003 and having seen men’s crew twice threatened, in 1971 and 1991, has set a similar goal. Insulating the sport from financial vulnerabilities has led to Friends' setting the long term objective of building men’s crew endowment levels to \$20 million by 2023. To date, funds under management of the UW Foundation - for the benefit of men’s crew - have reached about \$350,000, with another \$350,000 in known bequests in the wills of several supporters.
